Title: Newton Mill Limited

Archival history: The material was collected by David Sanderson, who worked in the offices of the estimating and costing department from 1961 until the Company's closure in 1972.

Scope and content: The material consists of journals, photographs, a calendar, plan, and published books relating to the history of the Company and employees.

System of arrangement: The material has been arranged into 5 series reflecting the activities of the employees and production.

Administrative history: The business Jacobsen Welch & Company was founded in 1893 by Mr.Stanley Welch, born in London on 25th September 1872 and son of a butcher, and Mr. T.O. Jacobsen. They had a small factory and office at Ludgate Square, London and produced stationary on the ground floor and basement. Mr Jacobsen was able to secure business with large stores and trade dealers. The business then moved to Aldersgate Street and then Sydney Avenue around 1896. In 1898 the firm became a limited company and business was good. Unfortunately Mr. Welch fell ill with typhoid fever but recovered in Australia and New Zealand, taking with him a case of samples with which to do business.

In 1899 the Company acquired the whole of the undertaking of the British Envelope Co. Ltd. in Hyde. Frank Welch, Stanley's brother joined the firm in 1900 and was responsible for the London and Continental trades. In 1905 Stanley Welch was elected to Hyde Borough Council. It was decided to build a completely new factory and the warehouse of this venture was completed in 1910. This year also saw the introduction of Waldorf Club Notepaper which became one of the first to be nationally advertised.
